### You are our Glory and Joy

I was blessed to travel again to Hyderabad, India this June, 2018. This was my third trip to India with PPMI and once again I was grateful for the rich experiences along the way: seeing the familiar faces of the pastors and wives, enjoying the most

delicious meals and table fellowship, and traveling through a part of the world so different from my own.

Each time I go, more of the barriers between my life and theirs seem to come down and rather than anonymous faces, their ministry, names, and dedication to the gospel of Jesus with little reward sinks deeper into my soul. This was especially clear as I was teaching from the book of Mark, where three times (8:31, 9:31, 10:32-34) Jesus teaches his disciples about his cross and theirs, and what it means to follow as a humble servant, leaving everything behind. Each time in Mark, the disciples don't quite understand what Jesus was saying.



I asked the pastors, what does servanthood look like in their culture ... do you know what Jesus is talking about here? And in their responses and nodding of heads I knew they knew it better than I did. For each PPMI pastor and wife, this weekend conference is like a retreat; it is their only annual vacation --
